Rita K. Noonan, PhD, is a sociologist and Branch Chief in CDC's Division of Overdose Prevention. Dr. Noonan and her staff oversee prevention and evaluation strategies that support CDC's \$300M program, Overdose Data to Action (OD2A). OD2A is designed to reduce drug overdose deaths and related harms in the United States by providing funding to 47 states and 16 large city/county health departments to improve public health surveillance, implement evidence-based prevention strategies, and shed light on emerging innovations in the field. Dr. Noonan also works closely with several High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTAs), managing the public health component of ONDCP's Overdose Response Strategy that links public health and public safety across 30 states. She has been the recipient of several prestigious awards, including a Fulbright Scholarship and a MacArthur Fellowship. She received her PhD from Indiana University.
