W/B HIDTA's Mission

Reduce drug trafficking and misuse by improving interagency collaboration, promoting accurate and timely information and intelligence sharing, and providing specialized training and other resources to its law enforcement, intelligence, treatment, and prevention initiatives.

As one of 33 individual HIDTAs comprising the Office of National Drug Control Policy's National HIDTA Program, the W/B HIDTA shares the National HIDTA Program's goals, which are to 1) Disrupt the market for illegal drugs by dismantling or disrupting drug trafficking and/or money laundering organizations; and 2) improve the efficiency and effectiveness of HIDTA initiatives.

W/B HIDTA initiatives investigated 225 drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) and money laundering organizations (MLOs), and were successful in disrupting or dismantling 121 of these organizations. 63 percent of the DTOs/MLOs were part of an international or multi-state operation. More than 929 federal, state, and local law enforcement agents, officers, analysts, and support personnel took part in 74 W/B HIDTA initiatives. Over 61 percent of the participants were from state or local agencies.

Law Enforcement Support

The W/B HIDTA supported training for 3,105 officers, agents, analysts, and support staff on drug-related subjects. Follow-up surveys of those attending W/B HIDTA training have routinely been 94 percent positive.

W/B HIDTA analysts provided analytical support to 293 investigations, and 100 percent of agents and officers surveyed reported the assistance was useful.

The W/B HIDTA's Investigative Support Center provided intelligence and deconfliction services to its law enforcement partners and, when permissible, shared information with treatment agencies and prevention coalitions.

Four state-level public health agencies coordinated and collaborated with W/B HIDTA initiatives.

Overdose Response

HIDTA's Overdose Response Strategy is a partnership between the HIDTA Program and the CDC.



This public safety and public health partnership focuses on the opioid epidemic and is designed to reduce drug overdoses.

Information Sharing

W/B HIDTA deconfliction systems performed 1,996 event deconflictions, actions that alert agencies when their tactical operations are occurring in the same general location and time frame as operations by other agencies. Additionally, the W/B HIDTA compared 30,734 pieces of case information looking for connections among cases. 159 law enforcement agencies participated in HIDTA case coordination efforts, and 60 law enforcement agencies participated in officer safety efforts.



ODMAP is a syndromic surveillance tool the W/B HIDTA created and is used to track suspected drug overdoses in real time nationwide.
